#### **FULL DAY KINDERGARTEN REINSTATED!**

The Board of Education gave its approval in the Spring to bring back all day, tuition-free kindergarten in the Maple Heights City Schools at no additional cost to the district. In 2011 over 50 jobs and several programs including full day kindergarten were eliminated in order to address a \$4.2 million deficit caused by a reduction in state and federal funds. In addition, all employees of the district have been on a pay freeze for the past two years to help keep the district fiscally sound. No additional staff members were hired to bring back the all day program, instead staff members were shifted into new roles to account for the additional kindergarten classes.

#### NEWMAN NAMED HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

After serving four years in the district as a teacher and the past three years as the freshman academy principal, Mr. Aaron Newman has accepted the position of Maple Heights High School Principal. Newman is excited about his new role. "I am thankful to have had the opportunity to serve all of our current high school upperclassmen as their freshman principal and I am looking forward to getting to know our incoming freshmen. We have some outstanding students and families. I want to challenge our kids to be the best they can be at everything they do."

Newman graduated from Columbia University with a degree in law before deciding to continue his path as an educator.

#### **ARE YOU ENROLLED?**

All students planning to attend the Maple Heights City Schools must be enrolled. Enrollments are by appointment only.

Enrollment packets are available online (mapleschools.com) or can be obtained at our school buildings or Board of Education. Instructions and requirements are contained in the packet. Enrollment packets must be completed prior to your appointment.

Please call the enrollment office at 216.587.6100, extension 3701 <u>after</u> completing the packet to schedule an appointment for registration. When registering your child, you will need:

- •Birth Certificate Original or certified copy (child must be 5 by 9/30/13)
- Social Security Card or Number
- •Complete Immunization Records
- Custody Papers (signed, certified copy, if applicable)
- Parent/Guardian's Ohio Driver's License or State ID
- •Withdrawal/Transfer Slip/Last Report Card
- Unofficial Transcript (high school only)
- •IEP/ETR/MFE (special education students only)
- •504 Plan (if applicable)
- Medical Exam Results (special needs, pre-school only)
- Proof of residency At least 3 forms are required. Such documents may include, but are not limited to, current voter registration card, or municipal income tax return, valid driver's license with current address, current utility bills, pay vouchers, current lease, and current insurance declaration page.

#### WHEN IS ORIENTATION & WHO IS MY CHILD'S TEACHER?

<u>Elementary Schools</u> will each hold a new student/parent orientation according to the following schedule:

Abraham Lincoln (K-1) – Thursday, August 15, 10:00 a.m. John F. Kennedy – Tuesday, August 13, 10:00 a.m. Barack Obama – Wednesday, August 14, 10:00 a.m.

<u>Middle School</u> Orientation will be held Friday, August 16, 10:00 a.m. Students are to meet in the gym. Parents are welcome to attend.

<u>High School</u> Freshmen Academy orientation will be Wednesday, August 14, 6:00 p.m. Orientation for students in grades 10 through 12 will be Thursday, August 15, 6:00 p.m. Parents are encouraged to attend. Current Student (grades 10 through 12) Schedule Pickup will be Thursday, August 15, from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m.

Students will be given class schedules at orientation.

#### WHAT IF I MISS ORIENTATION?

Class/homeroom lists will be posted at each building by August 20th.

#### SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM

This year our district is eligible for the Community Eligibility Options (C.E.O.) Program, which means all students in the district are eligible for free meals (breakfast and lunch). Additional information on the C.E.O. Program will be forthcoming in a mailing to each student's residence.

#### **SCHOOL FEES & FEE WAIVERS**

A fee is charged for each pupil to cover the cost of consumable materials such as workbooks, art and science supplies, classroom magazines, agendas, journals, etc.

Fees may be paid in cash or money order at your child's school. Prompt payment of fees is appreciated.

When applying for a waiver of student fees, the waiver form must be filled in completely. Incomplete forms cannot be processed. Forms can be obtained from your child's school office, the Board of Education or online at *mapleschools.com*.

\*Please note: High School fees are based on courses taken and certain class costs and dues are not waivable.

#### **EMERGENCY MEDICAL FORMS**

Please complete and return the Emergency Medical Form to your child's school immediately. All students must have a current form on file. This is a State requirement. Students won't be permitted to attend school without this form.

## CAN SCHOOL PERSONNEL GIVE MEDICATION TO STUDENTS?

Personnel <u>can</u> give medication. Students who are to receive medication during the school day must have a completed request for administration of medication by school personnel on file in the nurse's office. This form may be obtained at your child's school.

#### **FAMILY LIFE SCHOOL AGE CHILDCARE**

A before/after-care program for grades kindergarten through grade 5 is available to students. The Program is managed by Guidestone (formerly Berea Children's Home), but housed in-district at Abraham Lincoln School. The program is <u>not</u> operated by the district. The Program is scheduled to begin on your child's first day and will follow the school year calendar. To enroll your child or for additional information, please call 440-260-6001.

#### **INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES**

The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act mandates that every school district in the country develop a system to identify children with disabilities, birth through age 21, who live in their district.
